Attached is a petition, non-enforcement request, plans, calculations, quanity summary and assessment roll for the Lexington Farms, Section 6 Arm to the Richard Moffitt Drain.

I have reviewed the submittals and petition nad have found each to be in proper form.

I have made a personal inspection of the land described in the petition. Upon doing so, I believe that the drain is practicable; will improve the public health; benefit a public highway and be of public utility; and that the costs, damages and expenses of the proposed drain will probably be less than the benefits accuring to the owners of land likely to be benefitted. The drain will consist of the following: 6" SSD 255ft; 12" RCP 90ft; 18" RCP 140ft; (2) 48" RCP 110ft The total length of the drain will be 595 feet.

The above lengths reflect lineal footage as shown on the profile. When pipe is side by side only the length of one pipe is used so as not to double the drain length. Only the main subsurface drains (SSD) will be maintained as part of the regulated drain. The branches for each lot will not be maintained as part of the drain. The 6" SSD at the rear of Lots 103,104 and 106 will be part of the regulated drain.

I have reviewed the plans and believe the drain will benefit each lot equally. Therefore, I recommend each lot be assessed equally. I recommend a maintenance

assessment of \$30.00 per lot, \$5.00 per acre for roadways, with a \$30.00 minimum. With this assessment the total annual assessment for the drain /this section will be \$450.00.

The retention areas shown on the attached plan (Lakes 7 and 9) will not be maintained as part of the regulated drain. These are to be maintained by the Homeowners Association with only the inlet and outlet maintained as part of the regulated drain.

A portion of the storm sewer system in this section is replacing part of the existing Richard Moffitt Drain. Station 34+40 to 40+40 will be replaced with this section. Station 44+40 to 45+90 was replaced with Section 6 and Station 45+90 to 48+00 was replaced with Section 2. These relocations were approved at a hearing held by the Board on Luly 13, 1987.

I recommend a hearing be set for Decemeber 1989. I also recommend that if approved at hearing, the Board should approve the attached non-enforcement request.

The drainage will affect various lots in Lexington Farms _____, a subdivision in Hamilton County, Indiana. The general route of such drainage shall be in existing easements and along public roads as shown in the plans on file in the Surveyor's Office.

Petitioner believes that the cost, damages and expenses of the proposed improvement will be less than the benefits which will result to the owners of the land likely to be benefited thereby. Petetioner believes the proposed improvements will:

- (a) improve public health
- (b) benefit a public street
- (c) be of public utility

Petitioner agrees to pay the cost of construction of the drainage system and requests periodic maintenance assessments by the Board thereafter.

The Petitioner also agrees to the following:

- 1. To provide the Drainage Board a Performance Bond for the portion of the drainage system which will be made a regulated drain. The bond will be in the amount of 100% of the Engineers estimate. The bond will be in effect until construction of 100% of the system is completed and so certified by the Engineer.
- 2. The Petitioner shall retain an Engineer throughout the construction phase. At completion of the project the Petitioner's Engineer shall certify that the drainage FER 16 1989 system which is to be maintained as a regulated drain has allow COUNTY DRAINAGE been constructed as per construction plans.

- 3. The Petitioner agrees to request in writing to the County
 Surveyor any changes from the approved plan and must receive
 written authorization from the County Surveyor prior to
 implementation of the change. All changes shall be documented
 and given to the Surveyor to be placed in the Drain File.
- 4. The Petitioner shall instruct his Engineer to provide a reproducable print on a 24" x 36" mylar of the final design of the Drainage System. This shall be submitted to the County Surveyor prior to the release of the Performance Bond.
