RE: Petition to extend Jacob Schnieder Drain Attached is a petition filed by Richard L. Tescher for the extension of the Jacob Schnieder Drain. The petition asks that the natural stream which runs through the Country Wood Subdivision be added to the legal drain system.

When platting the subdivision a 75' easement per 3 was allowed on the stream for its protection. As a sipulation for approval of Section 4 of Country Wood the Noblesville Plan Commission at its October 15, 1979 meeting required that Mr. Tescher petition the Drainage Board to include the natural stream as a legal drain.

I have recieved an approval from Indiana Departement of Natural Resources concerning the proposal. The location of the proposed extension is shown on the attached plat in red. The proposal, as I have it shown, starts at the terminus of the Schnieder Drain and extends to the South West corner of Country Wood. This will add approximately 2700' to the length of the legal The easements have been shown more or less to the property line drain. because of the winding channel of the creek. The developer will be clearing any obstructions or debris from the channel. Because of the grade of the drain I do not believe clearing or straightening is necessary at this time.

Attached is a list of acreage which will be added to the assessment roll.

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
