TO: Hamilton County Drainage Board

RE: Stony Creek Drain, Cumberland Knoll Arm

Upon review of the drainage sheds, I believe that the Cumberland Knoll Drain should be made an arm to the Stony Creek Drain as the Cumberland Knoll Drain is a tributary to the Stony Creek Drain. This would also avoid a double assessment on the tracts currently assessed for the Cumberland Knoll Drain when the remainder of the Stony Creek Drain is assessed for maintenance.

On March 10, 1986 the Board held a hearing to establish the Cumberland Knoll Drain per my report dated January 7, 1986. (See Drainage Board Minutes Book 2, Page 121). At present the Cumberland Knoll Drain maintenance assessment affects 10 lots. The rate of assessment for the drain is set at \$30.00 per lot. This rate collects \$300.00 annually and the balance within the fund is \$1,511.87. There are no outstanding work orders for this drain at this time.

Also at this time I recommend to the Board that the area south of Stony Creek between the west right of way of State Road 37 on the west to the drainage shed boundaries of the Oliver Armstrong Drain to the south and the Wheeler and Wheeler Drain to the east be assessed to Stony Creek Drain. This area is comprised mainly of the Cumberland Knoll Arm residential areas along with scattered non-platted tracts. These tracts drain north into the Stony Creek section which became part of the regulated drain per my report dated January 4, 2007 which was approved by the Board at hearing on February 26, 2007. (See Hamilton County Drainage Board Minutes Book 11, Pages 155-158).

The current assessment for the Stony Creek Drain was set by the Board per my report dated June 6, 2006 and approved at hearing on July 24, 2006. (See Hamilton County Drainage Board Minutes Book 9, Pages 334-336). The per acre rates were adjusted for residential and agricultural per my report for the reconstruction dated April 6, 2010 and approved at the Board at hearing on July 26, 2010. (See Hamilton County Drainage Board Minutes Book 13, Pages 103-107). The current assessment is as follows:

- 1. Maintenance assessment for roads and streets set at \$10.00 per acre.
- 2. Maintenance assessment for agricultural tracts set at \$4.00 per acre with a \$15.00 minimum.
- 3. Maintenance assessment for non-platted residential tracts set at \$4.00 per acre with a \$15.00 minimum.
- 4. Maintenance assessment for commercial institutional and multi-family residential tracts set at \$10.00 per acre with a \$75.00 minimum.
- 5. Maintenance assessment for platted lots in subdivisions whose drainage systems will not be considered part of the regulated drain (those systems maintained by the City of Noblesville) set at \$35.00 per lot \$35.00 minimum. Common areas within subdivisions whose drainage systems will not be part of the regulated drain (those systems maintained by the City of Noblesville) shell be set at \$5.00 per acre with a \$35.00 minimum.
- 6. Maintenance assessment for platted lots within a subdivision whose drainage system will be part of the regulated drain set at \$65.00 per lot with a \$65.00 minimum. Common areas with regulated drain subdivisions set at \$10.00 per acre with a \$65.00 minimum.

The annual maintenance collection for this area will be \$1,234.10.

The current balance of the Cumberland Knoll Drain shall be kept separate and these funds expended for needed maintenance on the Cumberland Knoll Drain. This shall be done until the funds are exhausted. At that time funding for repairs shall then be taken from Stony Creek Drain fund. Collections for the Stony Creek Drain will begin 2012.

Future assessments for the drainage area of the Cumberland Knoll Drain will be made in the Stony Creek Drain fund. No further maintenance collections for the Cumberland Knoll Drain shall be made other than any delinquent assessments, penalties and interest which remain unpaid.

I recommend the Board set a hearing for this matter for February 28, 2011.

I am in receipt of your objection dated February 10, 2011. Your property currently has a watershed break which causes the drainage in the rear of the property to run east to the Wheeler & Wheeler Drain and the drainage in the front of the property to run to Stony Creek. You do not have a regulated drain on your property. However, you are within 47 feet of the Wheeler & Wheeler Drain from your east property line. It is up to property owners to run private drainage to the regulated drain. Since this open ditch is on the Stony Ridge Property Owners Association property, you would have to obtain permission to cross onto their property to get to the drain.

As to the drain in the front of your property, this is a roadside ditch and is the maintenance responsibility of the Hamilton County Highway Department. I have forwarded your complaint to that department.

I am in receipt of your objection dated February 10, 2011. Please be adware that the Cumberland Knoll Drain runs across the rear of your property. The six inch tile was installed when the lots were developed. This tile empties into the S.R. 37 side ditch and runs north into Stony Creek.

The water described in your letter is surface water which does run from under Cumberland Road, across your south neighbor and your yard, west between your home and the house to your north, across the rear of that home and into the S.R. 37 side ditch which then runs north into Stony Creek. This is a natural surface waterway which existed when the Cumberland Knoll lots were developed.

Your tracts on the east side of Cumberland Road are split between the Wheeler & Wheeler Drain and the Stony Creek Drain. Your east property line is within 144 feet of the Wheeler & Wheeler open ditch. Please be aware that the regulated drain does not have to be on your property to be assessed. Your property is within these drainage sheds.
