Re: University High School Arm, Spring Mill Run Drain

Attached is a petition, non-enforcement request, plans, calculations, quantity summary and assessment roll for the University High School Arm, Springmill Run Drain. I have reviewed the submittals and petition and have found each to be in proper form.

I have made a personal inspection of the land described in the petition. Upon doing so, I believe that the drain is practicable; will improve the public health; benefit a public highway and be of public utility; and that the cost, damages and expenses of the proposed drain will probably be less than the benefits accruing to the owners of land likely to be benefited. The drain will consist of the following:

24" RCP 423 ft

36" RCP 14 ft

Open Ditch 590 ft

24" HDPE 302 ft

Twin 24" RCP 52 ft

The total length of the drain will be 1,381 feet.

The open drain which is listed above is that portion of drain between the west property line of tract 17-13-05-00-00-003.002 and Str. 23 as shown on the plans for University High School by Ogle, McGuire and Shook Corporation, dated June 7, 2002. The open ditch also consists of the portion of drain included as part of the detention facilities between Str. 25 and 27, Str. 28 and 29 and Str. 30 to the south line of tract 17-13-05-00-00-005.001. The drain connects at this point with the existing Springmill Run Drain as located at the north property line of Kings Mill Section 4, Lot 91. (See my report dated March 17, 1999 for Spring Mill Run Drain, Kingsmill Section 4 Arm)

The detention area located between Str. 25 and 27 and between Str. 28 and 29 is to be considered part of the regulated drain. The maintenance, such as mowing, of the dry pond will be the responsibility of the High School. The Board will retain jurisdiction for ensuring the storage volume for which the pond was designed will be retained. Thereby, allowing no fill or easement encroachments. The easement for this area downstream of Str. 25 and upstream of Str. 23 will be as set out in IC 36-9-27-33(A).

I have reviewed the plans and believe the drain will benefit each tract equally. Therefore, I recommend each lot be assessed equally. I also believe that no damages will result to landowners by the construction of this drain. I recommend a maintenance assessment of \$2.00 per acre, with a \$25.00 minimum. With this assessment the total annual assessment for this drain/this section will be \$153.52.

Parcels assessed for this drain may be assessed for the Osborn-Collins or Williams Creek Drain at sometime in the future.

I believe this proposed drain meets the requirements for Urban Drain Classification as set out in IC 36-9-27-67 to 69. Therefore, this drain shall be designated as an Urban Drain.

I recommend that upon approval of the above proposed drain that the Board also approve the attached non-enforcement requests. These requests are for the reduction of the regulated drain easement to those easement widths as shown on the construction plans for the pipe section of the above described drain from Str. 23 to Str. 25 for University High School dated June 7, 2002 by the Ogle, McGuire and Shook Corporation. This section is that portion of the drain which crosses tract 17-13-05-00-00-003.002 and 17-13-05-00-00-003.000.

I recommend the Board set a hearing for this proposed drain for November 25, 2002.

I recommend the Board approve the drain's construction as complete and acceptable.








WATERSHED AREA





