Gentlemen:

I submit to you a request that the following drains be designated as Urban Drains as they meet the criteria that is set out in the Indiana Drainage Code, Section on Urban Drains (Burns Indiana Statues 27-2701):

IN THAT:

1. A reasonable portion of the land within the water shed has and is being converted from rural land to urban land,
2. This change in land use requires the drainage represented by an urban drain.

I also request that each be accepted as drains in need of repair, be it, reconstruction, general maintenance, relocation, etc., and that each be set up with Annual Assessment to meet the cost of maintaining each said drain.

It is my opinion as County Surveyor of Hamilton County that the improvement of each drain will:

1. Improve public health
2. Benefit the public highways of Hamilton County and the public streets in Carmel and Noblesville
3. Drain the grounds of a public school

4. Be of public utility

The report of the viewers was favorable and was filed.

Report of R. D. Horney, County Surveyor who was appointed to supervise the ~~repairing~~ and reconstruction of the above drain, would respectfully report that he has made a survey of the above drain and did proceed and definitely determine the best and cheapest method of dredging, the termini and route, location, character of the proposed work, and fix the same by metes and bounds, courses and distance and description, including grades and beach marks, including all necessary arms, estimated the cost thereof, divide the drain or ditch into sections of not more than one hundred feet in length, and compute and set out the number of cubic yards of excavation in each section, assessed the benefits or damages, as the case may be, to each separate tract of land in the water shed to be affected thereby, and to easements held by railway or other corporations, as well as to cities, towns, or other public or private corporations, including any land rights, easements, or water power, injuriously or beneficially affected, and do make report to the court, under oath.

Recommendations


Construct tile drain. Begin 670 ft. West and 105 ft. South of the N.E. Corner S.E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  N.E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  Sec. 2 Twp. 17 North Range 3 East, run Northwesterly with 8" tile approximately 1370 ft. There construct Junction Box or Y. Thence Southwesterly with 10" tile 1320 ft. Construct Junction Box or Y and connect present 8" tile system. Thence Southwesterly with 14" tile 1553 ft. Thence Southwesterly with 16" tile 630 ft. Terminating at a concrete Box under State Road #31 running to an open branch. Terminal of ditch approximately 25 rods West of S.W. Corner of N.W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of S.E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  Sec. 2 Twp. 17 North Range 3 East, use 20 ft. of 18" Corrugated Pipe at terminal. Also pave to end of Culvert. At Sta. 26+35 construct Intake or Manhole and at Sta. 27+15 Construct Intake or Manhole in road side ditch, at approximately Sta. 42+45 Construct Intake or Manhole.

Where any tile ditches cross Main ditch connect with main ditch by using regular Y's and cement joints.

Intakes to be as per plans and attached. Junction Boxes as per plans.

Arm No. 1

Begin 680 ft. North and 290 ft. West of the N.E. Corner S.W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  N.E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  Sec. 2 Twp. 17 North Range 3 East. Run South 27° 10' West 778 ft. terminating into main ditch at junction. At Sta. 13+70 on Main Ditch. To consist of 6" tile with Breather Pipe at end.

All ditches to be cut at least 6 inches wider than largest diameter of tile to be used. All tile shall be laid to a string and only bedded when laid and must be inspected before finished covering.

Tile shall be tightly laid and in straight line. Any joints  $\frac{1}{2}$ " open or larger shall be slabbed over with broken tile.

After Final inspection the Contractor shall fill the ditch full and clean up.

The Junction Boxes, Intakes and Head Walls shall be built to plans on file.

All concrete work to be 1- $\frac{1}{2}$ - $\frac{3}{4}$  mix. The cover plates shall be round top design similar to the Bee Hive tops or equal.

*(a)* Right of Way.

The Right of Way shall be cleaned at least 25 ft. on each side of ditch.

*(a)* Where ditch crosses County Highway Contractor shall use 28 ft. of 15" corrugated pure iron pipe or equal, 16 gauge.

*(a)* Tile.

The tile shall consist of Clay, shale, or Concrete drain tile. Tile to meet standard A.S.T.M. Specifications.

*(a)* ~~and~~ 20" x 12" Bell type Tile - near Head wall. All Contractors will be required to furnish a standard certified test of the tile they propose to use before the contract will be awarded by the Engineer.

*(a)* X We also would recommend that the CCC Camp located at Lebanon, Ind. be contacted for what assistance they might give us.

*(a)* However the Estimates as now made and assessments are for the total amount of construction by private parties.

*(a)* If Government assistance is given the amount of construction will be materially lower.

The forms for all concrete work to be built of dressed lumber and in a workman like manner.

*(a)* Location

*(a)* The ditch is located in Sec. 2 Twp. 17 North Range 3 East 2 miles South of Carmel just off State Road #31 1 $\frac{1}{2}$  miles North of Marion County line East of 31.
