Attached is a petition for a new drain, waiver of notice, assessment roll and plans for the proposed Woodhaven Drain. This drain consists of the drainage system within the proposed Woodhaven subdivision. I have found it to be in proper order.

This proposed drain consists of the following:

10 inlets

4 metal end sections

51'-12" RCP

373'-15" RCP

50'-24" Bit Coated CMP

4 man holes

100 CU YD Rip Rap

978'-18" RCP

950'-Open Ditch

670'-6" Perforated Plastic Drain TIle

Of the total lenght of 3072 feet of new drain, 55 feet of 15" RCP and 1 metal end section lies in Boone County along with approximately 0.09 acres of the water shed. I have requested a waiver from the Boone County Drainage Board for a joint board hearing. I expect the Boone County Board to grant this request at its August 10th meeting.

On August 3rd, a performance Bond dated July 31, 1981 for the storm sewers, burbs, stone in place and street monumnets in the amount of \$85,000.00 was submitted to and approved by the Hamiton County Board of Commissioners. This Bond will not be released until a certification

as noted in items 1 & 2 of the petition is submitted to the Board.

Upon personal inspection of the lands described and review of the plans of the proposed drain I believe:

1. That the proposed improvement is practicable;

 That the proposed improvement will improve the public health and benefit a public highway and;

3. The costs, damages and expenses of the proposed improvements will probably be less than the benefits which will result to the owners of lands likely to be benefited.

I believe that the Board should set an assessment cost of \$2.00/acre on the streets and \$20.00/lot, which would bring in \$478.00 per year. A hearing should be set for September 8, 1981.
